Prof. Wood is a University Professor of Human Origins and director of the Center for the Advanced Study of Human Paleobiology at George Washington University. While in medical school in England in 1968, he joined Richard Leakey's first expedition to Lake Turkana, Kenya, and he has done research in paleoanthropology ever since. He is the author or co-author of 12 books that range from a 1991 major monograph on the hominid cranial remains from Koobi Fora to the non-technical *Human Evolution, A Very Short Introduction*. He edits the Wiley-Blackwell Encyclopedia of Human Evolution and is the author of over 200-refereed scientific articles and book chapters. His research interests are taxonomy, phylogeny reconstruction and comparative morphology. He is an honorary fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons of England.
