## **RAMÓN GONZÁLEZ**

I got my B.Sc. in Biology and my M.Sc. in Microbiology from the University of Valencia in 1989. I then moved to IATA-CSIC (Valencia) where I prepared my PhD, awarded in 1993. I completed my training in Molecular Biology and Genetics as a post-doc (EMBO and Marie Curie Grants) at the Institute for Genetics and Microbiology of the University of Paris XI-CNRS Orsay-France (1994-1998). After a short period in Valencia I got joined CSIC in 1999 as a tenured scientist at IFI-CSIC, where I started a research group on food biotechnology. In 2008 we moved our group to Logroño to start a new Institute devoted to wine and grapevine research (ICVV-CSIC). My current research lines currently deal with wine yeast biotechnology, and involved fundamental research on physiology, genetics, and biotechnology of wine yeasts of different species, as well as the development of strains and winemaking procedures optimized to address the current challenges of enology in warm climates. Throughout my scientific career I have published above 80 articles in international peer reviewed journals, 6 patents (some of them have been or are currently under use) and above 100 contributions to scientific meetings.
