KRISHNA SRINIVASAN

Krishna Srinivasan is currently a Deputy Director in the Western Hemisphere Department (WHD) of the International Monetary Fund (IMF). In this capacity, he oversees the institution's work on several countries—including Bolivia, Brazil, Canada, Costa Rica, and Nicaragua—and the Department's research activities and its flagship product, Regional Economic Outlook (REO) for the Western Hemisphere. Prior to this, he was in the European Department, serving as the IMF's mission chief for the United Kingdom and Israel, and before that in the Research Department, where he led the IMF's work on the G-20. He was the lead editor of a recent IMF book Global Rebalancing: a Roadmap for Economic Recovery (with Hamid Faruqee). Krishna has been with the IMF since 1994 and has served in various capacities across the International Capital Markets, Policy Development and Review, African and Asian departments.

He secured his PhD in International Finance from Indiana University and a Masters from the Delhi School of Economics, India, and has published several papers both at the IMF and in leading academic journals.
