Dr. Hoda Atta is Egyptian born on October 24, 1960, married and has 2 girls. She received her Bachelor's degree of Medicine and Surgery in 1984 and Master degree of Public Health-Preventive and Social Medicine in 1989 from College of Medicine, Alexandria University, Egypt . She worked as research assistant in old Dominion University and in Eastern Virginia Medical School, Virginia, USA from 1990-1994. Dr. Atta was awarded a Doctoral dissertation grant from the National Institute of Health , AHCPR, USA, in 1993 and in 1994, she got her PhD degree with focus on epidemiology from Old Dominion University, USA .
