

Conferencia: La contribución española en Malaria y los esfuerzos para la eliminación

Is Senior Advisor on Malaria and other Communicable Diseases at the Pan American Health Organization (PAHO), Regional Office of the World Health Organization (WHO) in the Americas. A native of Guyana, South America, he graduated as a Doctor of Medicine in Havana, Cuba and completed post graduate studies in Tropical Medicine, Malariology and Epidemiology in Cuba, Venezuela and the United States of America. He began his career at the Ministry of Health, Guyana and in 1985 was designated Head of the Malaria and Vector Control Programme of that country.

He undertook Short Term Consultancies with PAHO and had a brief period as Epidemiologist with the Biomedicine Institute in Venezuela before joining the Pan American Health Organization in 1992 as a National Professional in the Guyana office. In 1995, he was attached to PAHO's Caribbean Programme Coordination in Barbados and provided technical cooperation in Vector Control in the Caribbean Region

In 1996, he was transferred to Nicaragua, Central America, where he provided technical cooperation in the Prevention and Control of Communicable Diseases. In November of that year he was selected for the position as PAHO's Communicable Diseases Advisor based in Guayaquil, Ecuador, where he worked until February 2001 when he was transferred to PAHO headquarters in Washington D.C. as Regional Advisor on Malaria, in which capacity he continues to function.
