### CV- Alex Henney

Alex Henney studied engineering at the Universities of Bristol and Virginia, with an English Speaking Union/Du Pont Fellowship and a Fulbright Scholarship, and some economics at the London School of Economics. Had a varied career including time in McKinsey; seconded to the civil service for a while; appointed chairman of the London Electricity Consultative Council and board member of London Electricity. In 1987 published *Privatised Power*, which was the first report in Britain (Europe?) to advocate a competitive restructuring of the electric industry with a pool. Subsequently, he worked with the government during the early days of restructuring and then advised extensively in Britain, Europe, North America, and ANZAC. He undertook comparative international studies of various facets of electricity industries including “Ensuring generation adequacy”; “The practices and principles of transmission pricing in competitive markets”; “An international assessment of competitive power markets”; “Electric mass market retailing”; “Smart Metering”; and “The impact of wind on power markets and transmission”. Alex was the founding secretary of the international Association of Power Exchanges and has published various articles in the *Electricity Journal*, *Public Utilities Fortnightly*, *Power UK*, and *Utilities Weekly* and published four books: “The economic failure of nuclear power in Great Britain” (1989); “The electricity industries of eleven west European countries” (1992); “The privatisation of the electricity supply industry in England & Wales” (1994); “The British Electric Industry 1990-2010: the rise and demise of competition” (2011).
