Alejandro Caparrós holds a PhD in Economic and is Senior Researcher (Investigador Científico) at the Institute for Public Goods and Policies (IPP) of the Spanish National Research Council (CSIC), and lecturer at the University Carlos III in Madrid. He was the Director of IPP-CSIC from 2015 to 2019, held previous positions at the CNRS in Paris and the University Paris-Est, and has been visiting

scholar at the Universities of Berkeley, Columbia, Paris II, Paris Est, Bordeaux, Göttingen, Exeter, Bath and Innsbruck. He is the incoming president of the Spanish-Portuguese Association of Environmental and Resource Economics and has participated in a large number of research projects funded by the European Commission and national agencies. He has also worked as consultant for the World Bank and collaborated with the United Nations Statistical Division. He currently serves as Lead Author of the chapter on International Cooperation for the WGIII Sixth Assessment Report of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC)

His research is based on micro-economic analyses of environmental public goods. His main research area uses game theory to analyze international environmental agreements, mainly resorting to bargaining theory. The goal is to analyze incentives for cooperation for different types of public goods, and to determine the negotiation procedures that are more likely to be successful. He has published in journals such as the Journal of the Association of Environmental and Resource Economists, Public Choice, American Journal of Agricultural Economics, Land Economics, Environmental and Resource Economics, Oxford Economic Papers and Energy Economics. He is co-editor of the journal Forest Systems and has been guest editor for Energy Policy.
