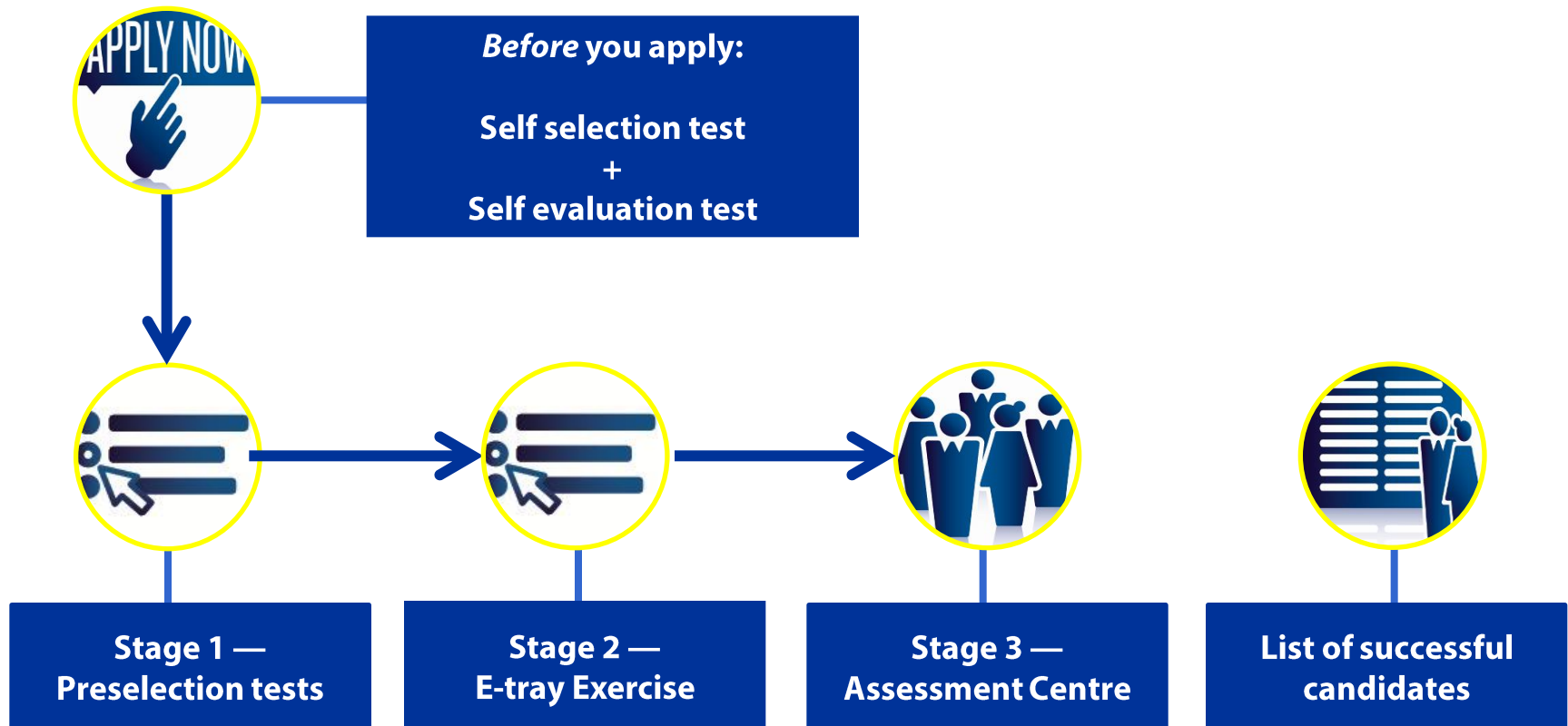

Example verbal reasoning

Whilst European countries have a long way to go before they reach the obesity levels so apparent in the USA (where 31 % of the population is considered obese), there is a clear trend for average weight to be on the increase in Western Europe. Traineeship

EC Traineeship – What is it?

- All Institutions offer traineeships – not centralised

Most trainees work in the Commission

– 1300 trainees per year

- Not a typical internship
no ‘photocopying’, you are paid (± €1200)
- 5 months: Oct>Feb or March>July

EC Traineeship – Who can apply?

Selection Criteria

- ✓ You do not have to be an EU national
- ✓ There is no age limit
- ✓ No prior work experience within the Institutions

You need:

- ✓ to have an undergraduate degree (Bachelor)
- ✓ to speak 2 EU Languages
- ✓ to apply in time
